

PIONEE


Employment rate of 25-34 year-olds in 2021

EBA Two-year basic vocational training with federal vocational certificate (2005):

Aims to improve access to vocational postcompulsory education through a 2-year program delivering a Federal Vocational Certificate. Evaluations suggest the program fosters permeability and most graduates successfully enter the labor market.

Primary and Secondary Education

Project ChagALL (2008):

A private project aimed at assisting highachieving migrants low-income from households to prepare for entering the academic track of upper secondary education. The programme includes individual tutoring and guidance for independent learning. Evaluations show that the program effectively helps targeted students enter and complete the academic track of upper secondary education.



Families use paid centerbased childcare

Participation in ECEC is highest among families with high socio-economic status.

65% vs 36%

Students without tertiary educated parents over represented (65%) in vocational upper-secondary programs compared to students with highly educated parents (36%).

Switzerland's education system has exceptionally high stratificiation and a high percentage of students with a migration background. Track transitions happen early and are characterized by considerable socioeconomic selectivity. While migration background is an insufficient indicator of diasadvantage due to heterogeneity.



Early Childhood Education

Language support for three-year-olds (2008): regional (Basel-Stadt) project aimed at providing guaranteed access to German language support in an ECEC center for children with little to no proficiency. The program is free of charge and requires obligatory attendance at least 2.5 Evaluations show a significant days/week. improvement in German language skills.
